

Nancy Abudu

Nancy Abudu is senior staff counsel with the ACLU Southern Regional Office in Atlanta where she works on a range of voting rights issues. She litigates cases in federal and state courts, and provides legal advice to ACLU affiliates, cooperating attorneys, and others seeking assistance and information.

More recently, her cases have included challenges to photo ID laws in South Carolina, Texas, and Wisconsin, as well as other voter suppression laws in states such as Iowa, Florida, South Dakota, and Mississippi.

Prior to working for the ACLU, Nancy was a staff attorney with the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals in Atlanta, and was an associate with the law firm Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom LLP in New York. She has also represented victims of domestic violence on behalf of the Legal Aid Society of New York and has presented testimony before the United Nations on human rights issues.

She received her B.A. from Columbia University (1996) and her J.D. from Tulane Law School (1999) where she served as a student attorney in the Environmental Law Clinic and won the “Most Outstanding Managing Editor Award” for her work on the Tulane Environmental Law Journal. She is on the board of the Georgia Citizens’ Coalition on Hunger, and is a member of the International Human Rights Committee for the ABA. She is a former board member of the Georgia Association of Black Women Attorneys, where she served as co-chair of the Political Action Committee, and a former legislative coordinator for Amnesty International USA.

She is admitted to practice in Georgia, New York, the U.S. Supreme Court, and several other federal courts.
